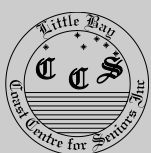

In her place we welcome Libby Hakim who will be tutoring Middle Eastern Dance on the new day of Mondays from 1:30pm.



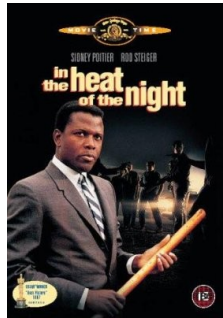
